22	Section 1. Section 25-4-73 of the Code of Alabama
23	1975, is amended to read as follows:

25	"(a) Each eligible individual who is totally
26	unemployed or partially unemployed in any week beginning on or
27	after July 3, 1983, shall be paid with respect to such week a

benefit in an amount equal to his or her weekly benefit

amount, less that part of the wages, if any, payable to him or

her with respect to such week which is in excess of \$15.00

fifteen dollars (\$15). Such benefit, if not a multiple of

\$1.00 one dollar (\$1), shall be computed to the nearest

multiple of \$1.00 one dollar (\$1).

"(b) With respect to weeks beginning prior to January 1, 1989, each eligible individual shall be paid with respect to such week as was provided in this section prior to such date.

"(c) With respect to benefit years effective on or after July 6, 2008 the effective date of the act amending this section, an individual shall serve a one-week waiting period with no benefits payable after the 13th compensable week of paid benefits during the first compensable week within a benefit year and prior to the 14th compensable week of benefits. The waiting week shall not be counted as a week of unemployment for the purposes of this section."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
