10 TO BE ENTITLED

13 Relating to Lauderdale County; to amend Sections 1
14 and 2 of Act 33, 1931 Regular Session (Local Acts 1931, p. 7),
15 to provide for the election of the Lauderdale County
16 Superintendent of Education by the qualified electors of the
17 county residing outside of the corporate limits of the City of
18 Florence.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

20 Section 1. Sections 1 and 2 of Act 33, 1931 Session
21 (Local Acts 1931, p. 7), are amended to read as follows:

22 "Section 1.

23 "(a) Commencing with the next election of the
24 Lauderdale County Superintendent of Education occurring after
25 the effective date of the act amending this section, the
26 superintendent shall be elected by the qualified electors of
27 Lauderdale County who reside outside of the corporate limits

1 of the City of Florence, and shall hold office for four years
2 and until his or her successor is elected and qualified.

3 "(b) The appropriate election officials shall
4 conduct elections of the Lauderdale County Superintendent of
5 Education in conformity with this act.

6 "Section 2.

7 "At the general election held in Lauderdale County
8 wherein the Lauderdale County Superintendent of Education
9 shall be elected, he or she shall assume office on the first
10 Monday in January immediately following the election and shall
11 hold office for a term of four years until his or her
12 successor is elected and qualified, unless sooner removed for
13 good cause, and each four years thereafter, the Lauderdale
14 County Superintendent of Education shall be elected by the
15 qualified electors of the county residing outside of the
16 corporate limits of the City of Florence, at the regular
17 election, and nomination for the office may be made in primary
18 elections as other county officers."

19 Section 2. This act shall become effective
20 immediately following its passage and approval by the
21 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
