9 Section 3. Sections 22-1-12, 22-23A-3, and 41-23-23,
10 Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

11 "§22-1-12.

12 "(a) The Department of Public Health shall establish
13 a comprehensive cardiac arrest survival plan for the training,
14 credentialing, and certification of primary cardiac care
15 providers in the use of semiautomatic external defibrillators
16 based on national guidelines for life-saving interventions of
17 persons suffering sudden, non-traumatic cardiac arrest
18 promulgated by the National Institutes of Health and the
19 National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute.

20 "(b) All funds from the appropriation in Act 99-372
21 of the 1999 Regular Session shall be used to assist in the
22 purchase or acquisition of semiautomatic external
23 defibrillators and training for emergency medical care
24 providers. To be eligible for assistance, emergency medical
25 care providers shall meet standards established by the
26 department.

1 ~~"(c) A Cardiac Arrest Survival Commission consisting~~
2 ~~of the State Health Officer, the State Emergency Medical~~
3 ~~Director, three members appointed by the Senate President Pro~~
4 ~~Tempore, three members appointed by the Speaker of the House,~~

12 "Selection of zones and the general guidelines for
13 implementation of the provisions of this article shall be as
14 follows:

15 "(1) The Alabama Department of Economic and
16 Community Affairs shall see that all applications are
17 processed as follows:

18 "a. The state or any governmental entity in the
19 proposed area may submit an application for zone designation.

20 "b. Each application should provide a statement of
21 incentives being offered by the governmental entities, such
22 as:

23 "1. Regulatory relief or waiver;

24 "2. Services provided;

25 "3. Tax incentives;

26 "4. Other nontax incentives.

1 "c. It is contemplated that state, county and/or
2 municipal governments may devise an innovative package of
3 local incentives in their respective jurisdictions and
4 aggressively pursue zone designation.

5 "(2) Zones shall be selected by the department, with
6 input from the advisory council, which shall have the
7 responsibility for the general implementation of the law.

8 "(3) An Enterprise Zone Advisory Council consisting
9 of members of the Alabama Department of Commerce, Southern
10 Development Council, Department of Labor, Department of
11 Education, State Department of Transportation, Department of
12 Environmental Management, Department of Agriculture and
13 Industries, Department of Revenue and other qualified
14 individuals or organizations shall be appointed by the
15 Governor with provisions to insure geographic representation
16 of rural and urban areas. This council shall be limited to 11
17 representatives and shall serve at the pleasure of the
18 Governor.

24 Section 4. This act shall become effective on the
25 first day of the third month following its passage and
26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
