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ENROLLED, An Act,

To alter or rearrange the boundary lines of the Town of Elmore, Elmore County, Alabama, so as to include within the corporate limits of the Town all territory now within such corporate limits and also certain other territory contiguous thereto, in Elmore County, Alabama.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. That the boundary lines of the Town of Elmore, Elmore County, Alabama, be, and the same are hereby altered or rearranged so as to include all of the territory heretofore encompassed by the corporate limits of the Town of Elmore, and in addition thereto the following described territory, to-wit:

ALABAMA HIGHWAY 14 ROW ANNEXATION - CALLAWAY CREEK
to INTERSECTION OF ALABAMA HIGHWAY 14 AND LUCKY TOWN ROAD

STATE OF ALABAMA

ELMORE COUNTY

Begin this right-of-way segment at the centerline intersection of Alabama Highway 14 and Callaway Creek (man-made canal), more particularly described as STA 140+00.00, Alabama Department of Transportation Project No. STPAA-0014(503), dated 2008; thence westerly 12,144 feet, (2.30 miles) more or less the centerline intersection of Alabama Highway 14 and Lucky Town Road and end of said

1 right-of-way segment. Said right-of-way segment lying in and
2 being a part of Sections 16, 17, 8, 7, and 18, T-18-N, R-18-E,
3 all in Elmore County, Alabama. This right-of-way segment is
4 intended to be inclusive of all right-of-ways presently
5 dedicated to the use of the public, through the Alabama
6 Department of Transportation (ALDOT), lying either side of the
7 above described line as shown on (ALDOT) right-of-way maps or
8 as heretofore amended.

9 Section 2. A map showing the territory proposed to
10 be annexed is on file in the office of the Judge of Probate in
11 Elmore County. The map is open to public inspection.

12 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
13 first day of the third month following its passage and
14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming a law.
