5 Relating to shared micromobility device systems; to
6 amend Section 32-1-1.1, as last amended by Act 2018-296, 2018
7 Regular Session, to further provide definitions; and to add
8 Section 32-19-2 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for
9 the operation of shared micromobility device systems.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. Section 32-1-1.1, Code of Alabama 1975,
12 as last amended by Act 2018-296, 2018 Regular Session, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 "§32-1-1.1.

15 "The following words and phrases when used in this
16 title ~~shall~~, for the purpose of this title, shall have
17 meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section, except
18 when the context otherwise requires:

19 "(1) ALLEY. A street or highway intended to provide
20 access to the rear or side of lots or buildings in urban
21 districts and not intended for the purpose of through
22 vehicular traffic.

23 "(2) ARTERIAL STREET. Any United States or state
24 numbered route, controlled-access highway, or other major
25 radial or circumferential street or highway designated by

1 local authorities within their respective jurisdictions as
2 part of a major arterial system of streets or highways.

3 "(3) AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE. Such fire
4 department vehicles, police vehicles and ambulances as are
5 publicly owned, and such other publicly or privately owned
6 vehicles as are designated by the Secretary of the Alabama
7 State Law Enforcement Agency or the chief of police of an
8 incorporated city.

9 "(4) BICYCLE. Every device propelled by human power
10 upon which any person may ride, having two tandem wheels
11 either of which is more than 14 inches in diameter.

12 "(5) BUS. Every motor vehicle designed for carrying
13 more than 10 passengers and used for the transportation of
14 persons; and every motor vehicle other than a taxicab,
15 designed and used for the transportation of persons for
16 compensation.

17 "(6) BUSINESS DISTRICT. The territory contiguous to
18 and including a highway when within any 600 feet along such
19 highway there are buildings in use for business or industrial
20 purposes, including, but not limited to, hotels, banks or
21 office buildings, railroad stations, and public buildings
22 which occupy at least 300 feet of frontage on one side or 300
23 feet collectively on both sides of the highway.

24 "(7) CANCELLATION OF DRIVER'S LICENSE. The annulment
25 or termination by formal action of the Secretary of the

1 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency of a person's driver's
2 license because of some error or defect in the license or
3 because the licensee is no longer entitled to such license,
4 but the cancellation of a license is without prejudice and
5 application for a new license may be made at any time after
6 such cancellation.

7 "(8) CONTROLLED-ACCESS HIGHWAY. Every highway,
8 street, or roadway in respect to which owners or occupants of
9 abutting lands and other persons have no legal right of access
10 to or from the same except at such points only and in such
11 manner as may be determined by the public authority having
12 jurisdiction over such highway, street, or roadway.

13 "(9) CROSSWALK. Either of the following:

14 "a. That part of a roadway at an intersection
15 included within the connections of the lateral lines of the
16 sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the
17 curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the
18 traversable roadway.

19 "b. Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or
20 elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by
21 lines or other markings on the surface.

22 "(10) DEALER. Every person engaged in the business
23 of buying, selling, or exchanging vehicles who has an
24 established place of business for such purpose in this state

1 and to whom current dealer registration plates have been
2 issued by the Department of Revenue.

3 "(11) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama State Law Enforcement
4 Agency acting directly or through its duly authorized officers
5 and agents.

6 "(12) DIRECTOR. The Secretary of the Alabama State
7 Law Enforcement Agency.

8 "(13) DRIVEAWAY-TOWAWAY OPERATION. Any operation in
9 which any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer, singly or in
10 combination, new or used, constitutes the commodity being
11 transported, when one set or more of wheels of any such
12 vehicle are on the roadway during the course of
13 transportation, whether or not any such vehicle furnishes the
14 motive power.

15 "(14) DRIVER. Every person who drives or is in
16 actual physical control of a vehicle.

17 "(15) DRIVER'S LICENSE. Any license to operate a
18 motor vehicle issued under the laws of this state.

19 "~~(15.1)~~ (16) ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITY
20 DEVICE. A self-balancing, l two non-tandem wheeled device
21 designed to transport only one person with an electric
22 propulsion system with an average power of 750 watts (1 h.p.),
23 ~~whose~~ that has a maximum speed on a paved level surface, when
24 powered solely by such a propulsion system while ridden by an
25 operator who weighs not more than 170 pounds, ~~is~~ of less than

1 20 m.p.h. The term shall not include a motorized bicycle,
2 motorized scooter, or motorized skateboard.

3 "~~(16)~~ (17) ESSENTIAL PARTS. All integral and body
4 parts of a vehicle of a type required to be registered
5 hereunder, the removal, alteration, or substitution of which
6 would tend to conceal the identity of the vehicle or
7 substantially alter its appearance, model, type, or mode of
8 operation.

9 "~~(17)~~ (18) ESTABLISHED PLACE OF BUSINESS. The place
10 actually occupied either continuously or at regular periods by
11 a dealer or manufacturer where his or her books and records
12 are kept and a large share of his or her business is
13 transacted.

14 "~~(18)~~ (19) EXPLOSIVES. Any chemical compound or
15 mechanical mixture that is commonly used or intended for the
16 purpose of producing an explosion and which contains any
17 oxidizing and combustive units or other ingredients in such
18 proportions, quantities, or packing that an ignition by fire,
19 by friction, by concussion, by percussion, or by detonator of
20 any part of the compound or mixture may cause such a sudden
21 generation of highly heated gases that the resultant gaseous
22 pressures are capable of producing destructive effects on
23 contiguous objects or of destroying life or limb.

1 "~~(19)~~ (20) FARM TRACTOR. Every motor vehicle
2 designed and used primarily as a farm implement, for drawing
3 plows, mowing machines, and other implements of husbandry.

4 "~~(20)~~ (21) FLAMMABLE LIQUID. Any liquid which has a
5 flash point of 70 F. ~~7~~ or less, l as determined by a fagliabue or
6 equivalent closed-cup test device.

7 "~~(21)~~ (22) FOREIGN VEHICLE. Every vehicle of a type
8 required to be registered hereunder brought into this state
9 from another state, territory, or country other than in the
10 ordinary course of business by or through a manufacturer or
11 dealer and not registered in this state.

12 "~~(22)~~ (23) GROSS WEIGHT. The weight of a vehicle
13 without load plus the weight of any load thereon.

14 "~~(23)~~ (24) HIGHWAY. The entire width between the
15 boundary lines of every way publicly maintained when any part
16 thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of
17 vehicular travel.

18 "~~(24)~~ (25) HOUSE TRAILER. Either of the following:

19 "a. A trailer or semitrailer ~~which~~ that is designed,
20 constructed, and equipped as a dwelling place, living abode,
21 or sleeping place, l ~~(either permanently or temporarily)~~, l and is
22 equipped for use as a conveyance on streets and highways, ~~or.~~

23 "b. A trailer or semitrailer ~~whose~~ that has a
24 chassis and exterior shell that is designed and constructed
25 for use as a house trailer, as defined in paragraph a., but

1 which is used instead permanently or temporarily for the
2 advertising, sales, display, or promotion of merchandise or
3 services, or for any other commercial purpose except the
4 transportation of property for hire or the transportation of
5 property for distribution by a private carrier.

6 "~~(25)~~ (26) IMPLEMENT OF HUSBANDRY. Every vehicle
7 designed and adapted exclusively for agricultural,
8 horticultural, or livestock raising operations or for lifting
9 or carrying an implement of husbandry and in either case not
10 subject to registration if used upon the highways.

11 "~~(26)~~ (27) INTERSECTION. Any of the following:

12 "a. The area embraced within the prolongation or
13 connection of the lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the
14 lateral boundary lines of the roadways of two highways which
15 join one another at, or approximately at, right angles, or the
16 area within which vehicles traveling upon different highways
17 joining at any other angle may come in conflict.

18 "b. Where a highway includes two roadways 30 feet or
19 more apart, then every crossing of each roadway of such
20 divided highway by an intersecting highway shall be regarded
21 as a separate intersection. In the event such intersecting
22 highway also includes two roadways 30 feet or more apart, then
23 every crossing of two roadways of such highways shall be
24 regarded as a separate intersection.

1 "c. The junction of an alley with a street or
2 highway shall not constitute an intersection.

3 "~~(27)~~ (28) LANED ROADWAY. A roadway which is divided
4 into two or more clearly marked lanes for vehicular traffic.

5 "~~(28)~~ (29) LICENSE or LICENSE TO OPERATE A MOTOR
6 VEHICLE. Any driver's license or any other license or permit
7 to operate a motor vehicle issued by the director under the
8 laws of this state, including any nonresident's operating
9 privilege as defined herein.

10 "~~(29)~~ (30) LOCAL AUTHORITIES. Either of the
11 following:

12 "a. Every county commission~~;~~ and.

13 "b. Every municipal and other local board or body
14 having authority to enact laws relating to traffic under the
15 constitution and laws of this state.

16 "~~(30)~~ (31) MAIL. To deposit in the United States
17 mail properly addressed and with postage prepaid.

18 "~~(31)~~ (32) METAL TIRE. Every tire the surface of
19 which in contact with the highway is wholly or partly of metal
20 or other hard, nonresilient material.

21 "~~(32)~~ (33) MOTOR VEHICLE. Every vehicle which is
22 self-propelled and every vehicle which is propelled by
23 electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not
24 operated upon rails, except for electric personal assistive
25 mobility devices.

1 "~~(33)~~ (34) MOTORCYCLE. Every motor vehicle having a
2 seat or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel
3 on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, but
4 excluding a tractor.

5 "~~(34)~~ (35) MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLE. Every motorcycle,
6 including every motor scooter, with a motor ~~which~~ that
7 produces not ~~to exceed~~ more than five brake horsepower nor ~~to~~
8 ~~exceed~~ exceeds 150 cubic centimeter engine displacement, and
9 weighs less than 200 pounds fully equipped, and every bicycle
10 with a motor attached.

11 "~~(35)~~ (36) NONRESIDENT. Every person who is not a
12 resident of this state.

13 "~~(36)~~ (37) NONRESIDENT'S OPERATING PRIVILEGE. The
14 privilege conferred upon a nonresident by the laws of this
15 state pertaining to the operation by such person of a motor
16 vehicle, or the use of a vehicle owned by such person, in this
17 state.

18 "~~(37)~~ (38) OFFICIAL TRAFFIC-CONTROL DEVICES. All
19 signs, signals, markings, and devices not inconsistent with
20 this title placed or erected by authority of a public body or
21 official having jurisdiction, for the purpose of regulating,
22 warning, or guiding traffic.

23 "~~(38)~~ (39) OWNER. A person, other than a lienholder,
24 having the property in or title to a vehicle. The term
25 includes a person entitled to the use and possession of a

1 vehicle subject to a security interest in another person, but
2 excludes a lessee under a lease not intended as security.

3 "~~(39)~~ (40) PARK or PARKING. The standing of a
4 vehicle, whether occupied or not, ~~otherwise than~~. The term
5 does not include a vehicle that is stopped temporarily for the
6 purpose of and ~~while~~ actually engaged in loading or unloading
7 merchandise or passengers.

8 "~~(40)~~ (41) PASSENGER CAR. Every motor vehicle,
9 except motorcycles and motor-driven cycles, designed for
10 carrying 10 passengers or less and used for the transportation
11 of persons.

12 "~~(41)~~ (42) PEDESTRIAN. Any person afoot.

13 "~~(42)~~ (43) PERSON. Every natural person, firm,
14 copartnership, association, or corporation.

15 "~~(43)~~ (44) PNEUMATIC TIRE. Every tire in which
16 compressed air is designed to support the load.

17 "~~(44)~~ (45) POLE TRAILER. Every vehicle without
18 motive power designed to be drawn by another vehicle and
19 attached to the towing vehicle by means of a reach or pole, or
20 by being boomed or otherwise secured to the towing vehicle,
21 and ordinarily used for transporting long or irregularly
22 shaped loads such as poles, pipes, or structural members
23 capable, generally, of sustaining themselves as beams between
24 the supporting connections.

1 "~~(45)~~ (46) POLICE OFFICER. Every officer authorized
2 to direct or regulate traffic or to make arrests for
3 violations of traffic regulations.

4 "~~(46)~~ (47) PRIVATE ROAD or DRIVEWAY. Every way or
5 place in private ownership and used for vehicular travel by
6 the owner and those having express or implied permission from
7 the owner, but not by other persons.

8 "~~(47)~~ (48) RAILROAD. A carrier of persons or
9 property upon cars other than street cars, operated upon
10 stationary rails.

11 "~~(48)~~ (49) RAILROAD SIGN or SIGNAL. Any sign,
12 signal, or device erected by authority of a public body or
13 official or by a railroad and intended to give notice of the
14 presence of railroad tracks or the approach of a railroad
15 train.

16 "~~(49)~~ (50) RAILROAD TRAIN. A steam engine, electric
17 or other motor, with or without cars coupled thereto, operated
18 upon rails.

19 "~~(50)~~ (51) RECONSTRUCTED VEHICLE. Every vehicle of a
20 type required to be registered hereunder materially altered
21 from its original construction by the removal, addition, or
22 substitution of essential parts, new or used.

23 "~~(51)~~ (52) REGISTRATION. The registration
24 certificate or certificates and registration plates issued

1 under the laws of this state pertaining to the registration of
2 vehicles.

3 "~~(52)~~ (53) RESIDENCE DISTRICT. The territory
4 contiguous to and including a highway not comprising a
5 business district when the property on such highway for a
6 distance of 300 feet or more is in the main improved with
7 residences or residences and buildings in use for business.

8 "~~(53)~~ (54) REVOCATION OF DRIVER'S LICENSE. The
9 termination by formal action of the director of a person's
10 license or privilege to operate a motor vehicle on the public
11 highways, which termination shall not be subject to renewal or
12 restoration except that an application for a new license may
13 be presented and acted upon by the director after the
14 expiration of the applicable period of time prescribed in this
15 title.

16 "~~(54)~~ (55) RIGHT-OF-WAY. The right of one vehicle or
17 pedestrian to proceed in a lawful manner in preference to
18 another vehicle or pedestrian approaching under such
19 circumstances of direction, speed, and proximity as to give
20 rise to danger of collision unless one grants precedence to
21 the other.

22 "~~(55)~~ (56) ROAD TRACTOR. Every motor vehicle
23 designed and used for drawing other vehicles and not so
24 constructed as to carry any load thereon either independently
25 or any part of the weight of a vehicle or load so drawn.

1 "~~(56)~~ (57) ROADWAY. That portion of a highway
2 improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel,
3 exclusive of the berm or shoulder. In the event a highway
4 includes two or more separate roadways the term "roadway" as
5 used herein shall refer to any such roadway separately but not
6 to all such roadways collectively.

7 "~~(57)~~ (58) SAFETY ZONE. The area or space officially
8 set apart within a roadway for the exclusive use of
9 pedestrians and which is protected or is so marked or
10 indicated by adequate signs as to be plainly visible at all
11 times while set apart as a safety zone.

12 "~~(58)~~ (59) SCHOOL BUS. Every motor vehicle that
13 complies with the color and identification requirements set
14 forth by statute or regulation and is used to transport
15 children to or from school or in connection with school
16 activities, but not including buses operated by common
17 carriers in urban transportation of school children.

18 "(60) SCOOTER. A device weighing less than 100
19 pounds that satisfies all of the following:

20 "a. Has handlebars and an electric motor.

21 "b. Is solely powered by the electric motor or human
22 power.

23 "c. Has a maximum speed of no more than 20 mph on a
24 paved level surface when powered solely by the electric motor.

1 "This term does not include an e-bike, EPAMD,
2 Segway, motorcycle, or moped.

3 "~~(59)~~ (61) SECURITY AGREEMENT. A written agreement
4 which reserves or creates a security interest.

5 "~~(60)~~ (62) SECURITY INTEREST. An interest in a
6 vehicle reserved or created by agreement and which secures
7 payment or performance of an obligation. The term includes the
8 interest of a lessor under a lease intended as security. A
9 security interest is perfected when it is valid against third
10 parties generally, subject only to specific statutory
11 exceptions.

12 "~~(61)~~ (63) SEMITRAILER. Every vehicle with or
13 without motive power, other than a pole trailer, designed for
14 carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor
15 vehicle and so constructed that some part of its weight and
16 that of its load rests upon or is carried by another vehicle.

17 "(64) SHARED MICROMOBILITY DEVICE. A type of
18 transportation device that includes a bicycle, tricycle,
19 scooter, hoverboard, skateboard, pedal car, or similar device,
20 except a device used as an electrical personal assistive
21 mobility device by a person with disabilities, used in a
22 shared micromobility device system.

23 "(65) SHARED MICROMOBILITY DEVICE SYSTEM. A system
24 that provides shared micromobility devices to users for
25 short-term rentals, whether or not the system requires docking

1 stations or other similar fixed infrastructure to receive or
2 return the shared micromobility device.

3 "~~(62)~~ (66) SIDEWALK. That portion of a street
4 between the curb lines, or the lateral lines of a roadway, and
5 the adjacent property lines, intended for use by pedestrians.

6 "~~(63)~~ (67) SOLID TIRE. Every tire of rubber or other
7 resilient material which does not depend upon compressed air
8 for the support of the load.

9 "~~(64)~~ (68) SPECIAL MOBILE EQUIPMENT. Every vehicle
10 not designed or used primarily for the transportation of
11 persons or property and only incidentally operated or moved
12 over a highway, including, but not limited to: Ditch digging
13 apparatus, well boring apparatus, and road construction and
14 maintenance machinery such as asphalt spreaders, bituminous
15 mixers, bucket loaders, tractors other than truck tractors,
16 ditchers, levelling graders, finishing machines, motor
17 graders, road rollers, scarifiers, earth moving carry-alls and
18 scrapers, power shovels and drag lines, and self-propelled
19 cranes, and earth moving equipment. The term does not include
20 house trailers, dump trucks, truck mounted transit mixers,
21 cranes or shovels, or other vehicles designed for the
22 transportation of persons or property to which machinery has
23 been attached.

24 "~~(65)~~ (69) SPECIALLY CONSTRUCTED VEHICLE. Every
25 vehicle of a type required to be registered hereunder not

1 originally constructed under a distinctive name, make, model,
2 or type by a generally recognized manufacturer of vehicles and
3 not materially altered from its original construction.

4 "~~(66)~~ (70) STAND or STANDING. The halting of a
5 vehicle, whether occupied or not, ~~otherwise than~~. The term
6 does not include a vehicle that is halted temporarily for the
7 purpose of and ~~while~~ actually engaged in receiving or
8 discharging passengers.

9 "~~(67)~~ (71) STATE. A state, territory, or possession
10 of the United States, the District of Columbia, the
11 Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or a province of Canada.

12 "~~(68)~~ (72) STOP. When required, means complete
13 cessation from movement.

14 "~~(69)~~ (73) STOP or STOPPING. When prohibited, means
15 any halting, even momentarily, of a vehicle, whether occupied
16 or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other
17 traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police
18 officer or traffic-control sign or signal.

19 "~~(70)~~ (74) STREET. The entire width between boundary
20 lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof
21 is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular
22 travel.

23 "~~(71)~~ (75) SUSPENSION OF DRIVER'S LICENSE. The
24 temporary withdrawal by formal action of the Secretary of the
25 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency of a person's license or

1 privilege to operate a motor vehicle on the public highways,
2 which temporary withdrawal shall be for a period specifically
3 designated by the director.

4 "~~(72)~~ (76) THROUGH HIGHWAY. Every highway or portion
5 thereof on which vehicular traffic is given preferential
6 right-of-way, and at the entrances to which vehicular traffic
7 from intersecting highways is required by law to yield the
8 right-of-way to vehicles on such through highway in obedience
9 to a stop sign, yield sign, or other official traffic-control
10 device, when such signs or devices are erected as provided in
11 this title.

12 "~~(73)~~ (77) TRACKLESS TROLLEY COACH. Every motor
13 vehicle which is propelled by electric power obtained from
14 overhead trolley wires but not operated upon rails.

15 "~~(74)~~ (78) TRAFFIC. Pedestrians, ridden or herded
16 animals, vehicles, streetcars, and other conveyances either
17 singly or together while using any highway for purposes of
18 travel.

19 "~~(75)~~ (79) TRAFFIC-CONTROL SIGNAL. Any device,
20 whether manually, electrically, or mechanically operated, by
21 which traffic is alternately directed to stop and permitted to
22 proceed.

23 "~~(76)~~ (80) TRAILER. Every vehicle with or without
24 motive power, other than a pole trailer, designed for carrying
25 persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and

1 so constructed that no part of its weight rests upon the
2 towing vehicle.

3 "~~(77)~~ (81) TRANSPORTER. Every person engaged in the
4 business of delivering vehicles of a type required to be
5 registered hereunder from a manufacturing, assembling, or
6 distributing plant to dealers or sales agents of a
7 manufacturer.

8 "~~(78)~~ (82) TRUCK. Every motor vehicle designed,
9 used, or maintained primarily for the transportation of
10 property.

11 "~~(79)~~ (83) TRUCK PLATOON. A group of individual
12 commercial trucks traveling in a unified manner at
13 electronically coordinated speeds at following distances that
14 are closer than would be reasonable and prudent without the
15 electronic coordination.

16 "~~(80)~~ (84) TRUCK TRACTOR. Every motor vehicle
17 designed and used primarily for drawing other vehicles and not
18 so constructed as to carry a load other than a part of the
19 weight of the vehicle and load so drawn.

20 "~~(81)~~ (85) URBAN DISTRICT. The territory contiguous
21 to and including any street which is built up with structures
22 devoted to business, industry, or dwelling houses situated at
23 intervals of less than 100 feet for a distance of a quarter of
24 a mile or more.

1 "~~(82)~~ (86) VEHICLE. Every device in, upon, or by
2 which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn
3 upon a highway, excepting devices moved by human power or used
4 exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks or electric
5 personal assistive mobility devices; provided, that for the
6 purposes of this title, a bicycle or a ridden animal shall be
7 deemed a vehicle, except those provisions of this title, which
8 by their very nature can have no application."

9 Section 2. Section 32-19-2 is added to the Code of
10 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

11 §32-19-2.

12 (a) A shared micromobility device system may not
13 operate or deploy shared micromobility devices on the public
14 highways or bikeways of the state without first obtaining
15 authorization or permission from the applicable county or
16 municipality in which the shared micromobility device system
17 will be operated.

18 (b) Every person riding a shared micromobility
19 device shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject
20 to all of the duties applicable to the rider of a bicycle in
21 this title, except as to specific provisions in this section
22 and except as to those specific provisions in this title which
23 by their nature can have no application.

24 (c) A person may not park a shared micromobility
25 device on a sidewalk in a manner that impedes the normal or

1 reasonable movement of pedestrian or other traffic or in
2 violation of county or municipal parking regulations.

3 (d) A shared micromobility device is not a motor
4 vehicle and is not subject to the provisions of this title
5 relating to insurance, license plates, registration,
6 operator's licenses, or certificates of title.

7 (e) A shared micromobility device shall be labeled
8 with visible language identifying its use in a shared
9 micromobility device system.

10 (f) The owner or operator of a shared micromobility
11 device system shall procure and keep in full force a
12 commercial liability insurance policy with minimum limits of
13 one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence, insuring
14 against bodily injury, including death, and property damage
15 caused by the negligence or wantonness of the owner or
16 operator of a shared micromobility device system.

17 (g) Counties and municipalities may regulate the
18 operation of shared micromobility devices. The authorization
19 or permission from the applicable county or municipality may
20 be conditioned on certain requirements, including, but not

22 (1) Minimum insurance requirements that may be in
23 addition to the mandatory insurance requirements under
24 subsection (f).

25 (2) Age requirements of users.

1 (3) Safety rules and maintenance requirements.

2 (4) Such other requirements as the county or
3 municipality deems advisable.

4 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
5 first day of the third month following its passage and
6 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
