WHEREAS, the state is at risk of losing out on capital investment and economic opportunity that is going to other states because we have yet to provide a statewide clear, consistent, and fair path for all wireless providers to deploy the equipment necessary to deliver the latest wireless broadband technology; and

WHEREAS, Alabama's neighbors, Georgia, Tennessee, Florida, Arkansas, and North Carolina have already passed small wireless legislation; and

WHEREAS, twenty-five states have already passed legislation facilitating the deployment of small wireless facilities by, among other things, authorizing wireless providers to install facilities in the public rights-of-way, adopting streamlined permitting processes; and capping rates and fees at reasonable levels to encourage investment while enabling local governments to recoup their costs; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Advanced Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Task Force is hereby established and is charged with reviewing and considering small wireless legislation passed in other states, reviewing and considering language from federal laws and regulations, including the

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the task force shall be composed of three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House, and three senators, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and at least one member of the minority party shall be included from the House of Representatives and Senate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the task force shall seek and consider input from interested representatives from the small wireless providers in the state, representatives from the Association of County Commissions and the Alabama League of Municipalities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House, and the Legislative Services Agency shall provide support to the task force as needed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the task force shall submit a report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House not later than October 1, 2019, including proposed small wireless facilities deployment legislation that is consistent with the requirements of federal and state laws, regulations, and rules.
